Judge Allan L. Goode, 69, of Fort Dodge, passed away on Saturday, September 04, 2010 at the Paula J. Baber Hospice House.

Allan Louis Goode was born on June 25, 1941, in Bloomfield, IA. He attended schools there and graduated from Davis County Community High School.
