

Memorial Resolution
CAMERON B. ARNOLD

Cameron B. Arnold was born June 26, 1939, in Spirit Lake, Iowa, the son of Vinton and Bertha Arnold. He attended school in Spirit Lake, graduating from Spirit Lake High School. He attended Buena Vista College and the University of Iowa, receiving his B.A. from the University of Iowa. He attended Iowa Law School and received his J.D. in 1965.

He commenced the practice of law in Spirit Lake in 1965. On July 1, 1974, he took office as a district associate judge, and he served as such till his death on January 21, 1998, at McKennon Hospital, Sioux Falls, SD., a period of over 23 years. He served as president of the Iowa Judges Association for the year 1984-1985. He also served on the State Commission on Zoning and Managment and the State Commission on Parental Notification.

He married Karen Lynne Fanth on May 11, 1963, in Iowa City, Iowa. He was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Spirit Lake and was a member of the Knights of Columbus, 4th degree.

He is survived by his wife and their three children: Beth of Lebanon, Tenn., Christian of Minneapolis, Minn., and Chuck of Nashville, Tenn.

Judge Arnold was an experienced and conscientious judge and his services on the bench and bar, to his community, and to this Association entitle him to the gratitude of all who knew him.
